Infinity Scarf

Approximate Finished Size: 9" x 35" (circumference)

A luxurious and beginner friendly project! Make one for yourself and a few more to pamper your friends.

Fabric Requirements (as shown)

• 1 yard Luxe Cuddle[®] Mountain Fox Pewter/Beige (makes 3 scarves)

Suggested Notions

- 90/14 stretch machine needle
- Polyester thread
- Felt tip marker and/or ballpoint pen
- Rotary cutter and mat
- Micro-serrated scissors
- Craft knife
- Hand-sewing needle
- Long, flower head pins
- Walking foot






Cutting

1. Mark an 18" x 36" rectangle on the wrong side of Luxe Cuddle*, parallel to the selvedge.


Note: By cutting parallel to the selvedge, you can make 3 scarves.



2. Cut the Cuddle® along the lines.

Assembly

 With right sides together, fold the fabric in half lengthwise.
Double pin along the long edge.



2. Sew with ½" seam allowance, backstitching at the beginning and end of the seam.



- 3. Turn right side out with the seam along one edge, and the fold on the opposite side.
- 4. Fold in half widthwise, keeping the seam on one side and the lengthwise fold on the other.
- 5. Rotate and twist at the open end so that a seam aligns with a fold on the top and the bottom.

Note: There are 4 visible layers of Cuddle[®] at the open end.




6. With one hand, hold the center two layers together tightly.

Note: The center layers will be right sides facing.

7. Continuing to hold the center layers together with one hand, slide your other hand down one side of the tube to the bottom. Grab and pull the tube until it is inside out.

Note: As you reach down, your hand will slide between the wrong sides of the fabric.

8. When you have the tube inside out, check that it looks like this:



9. With the tube now inside out, pin the cut edges together, perpendicular to the opening. Mark a 3" gap for turning.


Note: If your machine has a free arm, using it will make the next step easier.



10. Sew around the circle, leaving the 3" gap open. Sew an "L" at the gap ends.

Note: The "L" pivot at the gap secures the seam ends when you turn

the scarf right side out and also helps the seam allowance turn in at the gap.



Finishing

- 1. Pull the entire scarf right side out through the gap. You now have a scarf with a möbius twist.
- 2. Pin the turning gap closed. Hand sew using a ladder stitch.



Ladder stitch: Using polyester thread and a hand-sewing needle, catch one side of the opening, then the other. Pull to tighten every few stitches.

Cuddle® Basics

- Trace measurements on wrong side of Cuddle[®] with a felt tip marker or ballpoint pen.
- To help reduce Cuddle® dust, cut Luxe Cuddle® from the reverse side with a rotary cutter or craft knife.
- Shake cut pieces or put in a no-heat dryer with a damp washcloth for a few minutes to remove loose fibers.
- 4. Sew with polyester thread in the top and the bobbin.

- 5. Use 2 rows of pins—the first row every 1½" along the seam line and a second row 1" to the left and parallel to the cut edge.
- 6. Increase stitch length to 3-4 mm.
- 7. Backstitch at the beginning and end of each seam.
- 8. Seam allowances are ½" unless otherwise noted.
- 9. Use a walking or even-feed foot, if possible. It makes a difference!
