featuring Quilting Cuddle®

Approximate Finished Size: 41" x 41"

Rounds of coordinating Quilting Cuddle® give a fresh look to this classic quilt pattern. Quilting Cuddle® is a low-pile fabric with minimal stretch—a perfect blend of softness and stability and ideal for quilting projects.

Fabric Requirements*

From Quilting Cuddle® Meet Me in the Garden

- 2¾ yards, Garden Roses Woodrose (Fabric 1)
- ¾ yard, Garden Bouquet Snow (Fabric 2)
- ¼ yard, Garden Tonal Woodrose (Fabric 3)
- ¾ yard, Garden Leaves Green (Fabric 4)

* Quilting Cuddle® is 45" wide.

Necessary Notions

- Crib size batting, low-loft polyester; recommended: Quilters Dream Poly Request

Suggested Notions

- 90/14 stretch machine needle
- Polyester thread
- Spray baste
- Fabric glue stick; recommended: Odif 505 Temporary Adhesive Glue Stick
- Fabric-safe marker
- Rotary cutter, mat, and acrylic ruler
- Micro-serrated scissors and/or craft knife
- Long, flower head pins and/or fabric clips
- Point turner
- Stiletto
- Walking foot, optional

Approximate Finished Size: 41" x 41"

DIRECTIONS

- Read the *Working with Quilting Cuddle® Tip Sheet* before beginning.
- Seam allowances are ¼" unless noted.
- Gently press seams open.

Cutting

- Label pieces as they are cut. Copy labels as they are provided on the opposite page.
- Mark the nap on the back of each piece. Keep naps consistent during assembly.

Note: All measurements are written as (WIDTH X HEIGHT). This ensures that the naps all run in the same direction!

Meet Me in the Garden Quilting Cuddle®

Fabric 1: Garden Roses Woodrose

- 1 (4½" x 4½"), Center Square: **A**
- 4 (5" x 5"), Round 2: **C**
- 2 (32½" x 4½"), Round 4: **L**
- 2 (4½" x 32½"), Round 4: **J**
- 4 (1¾" x 45"), Binding
- 1 (45" x 45"), Backing

Fabric 2: Garden Bouquet Snow

- 2 (2½" x 4½"), Round 1: **D**
- 2 (8½" x 2½"), Round 1: **E**
- 4 (9" x 9"), Round 3: **G**

Fabric 3: Garden Tonal Woodrose

- 4 (5" x 5"), Round 2: **B**

Fabric 4: Garden Leaves Green

- 4 (4½" x 4½"), Round 2: **F**
- 4 (8½" x 8½"), Round 3: **I**
- 4 (9" x 9"), Round 3: **H**
- 4 (4½" x 4½"), Round 4: **K**

Assembly

Center Square + Round 1

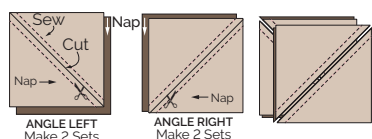
1. With naps running down, sew a **D** piece to the both sides of **A**.
2. Sew **E** to the top and bottom.



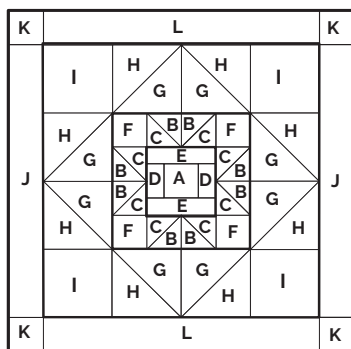
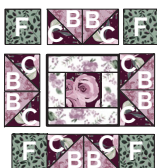
Add Round 2

Make Half Square Triangles (HSTs)

1. Noting the direction of the nap, mark a diagonal line on the wrong side of the four **B** squares.
2. Following the nap as indicated, pin each **B** square to a **C** square.
3. Sew ¼" on both sides of the marked line. Cut on the line.



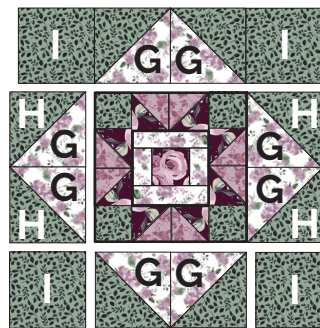
4. Press seams open.
5. Trim each HST to 4½" x 4½".
6. Pair the HSTs, making sets with the naps going down when in place around Round 1.
7. Minding the nap, sew a **C/B/B/C** unit to the left and the right.
8. Sew an **F** square to each side of the other HSTs. Sew to the top and bottom to complete Round 2.



FINAL ASSEMBLY DIAGRAM

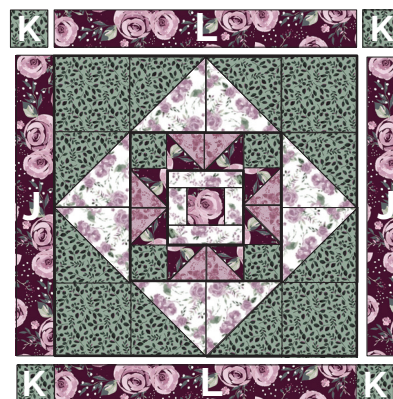
Add Round 3

1. In the same manner as Round 2, make HSTs with **G** and **H** squares.
2. Pair two **G/H** HSTs, sewing sets so the naps will go down when in place around Round 2.
3. Minding the nap, sew an **H/G/G/H** unit to the each side of Round 2.
4. Sew an **I** square to each side of the other HSTs. Sew to the top and bottom to complete Round 3.



Add Round 4

1. Sew a **J** strip to each side of Round 3.
2. Sew a **K** square to each side of the **L** strips. Sew to the top and bottom to complete Round 4.



Finishing

Quilt the top

1. Layer backing, batting, and completed quilt top.
2. Quilt as desired through all layers. Quilting lines should be a minimum of 8" apart.
3. Square up the quilt. Trim, if necessary.
4. Stabilize perimeter by sewing the edge with a wide (5x5mm) zigzag.

Binding

1. Pin Binding strips, right sides together, on the diagonal.
2. Sew between the pins. Trim each seam allowance to ¼".



Note: Have the nap of the Binding strips go in the same directions.

3. Bind the quilt.

Labels for Cut Pieces

Copy the following chart @ 200%. Cut apart to use as labels. Use a dot of fabric glue (such as Odif 505) to affix labels to the back of each piece as you cut.
