## Rainbow Pillow

Approximate Finished Size: 24" x 18"

Maybe there isn't a pot of gold at the end of this rainbow, but there is still a lot of cozy delight. A fun pillow for all ages.

#### Fabric Requirements (as shown)

- 1/8 yard Cuddle® 3 Paris Pink
- ½ yard Cuddle® 3 Coral
- 3/8 yard Cuddle® 3 Banana
- 3/8 yard Cuddle® 3 Lilac
- ¼ yard Cuddle® 3 Turquoise
- 3% yard Luxe Cuddle® Marble Snow, for clouds

#### **Suggested Notions**

- Craft-size batting, 34" x 45"
- Polyester filling, for stuffing
- 90/14 stretch machine needle
- Polyester thread
- Felt tip marker or ballpoint pen
- Rotary cutter and mat
- Micro-serrated scissors
- Craft knife
- Long, flower head pins
- Fabric clips
- Point turner
- Basting spray
- Walking foot

#### Cutting

Note: To make cutting the arcs more manageable, the Cuddle<sup>®</sup> is first cut into **horizontal** rectangles. Rectangles are then cut using the Arc Templates.

#### Cut the Cuddle® rectangles & strips:

- 1. From Paris Pink, cut:
  - 1 (42" x 3") strip, *Top Band*.
- 2. From Coral, cut:
  - 2 (21" x 14") rectangles, *Arcs*.
- 3. From Banana, cut:
  - 2 (18" x 12") rectangles, *Arcs*.
- 4. From Lilac, cut:
  - 2 (16" x 12") rectangles, *Arcs*.
- 5. From Turquoise, cut:
  - 1 (22" x 3") strip, *Bottom Band*.
  - 2 (14" x 9") rectangles, *Arcs*.
- 6. From Marble Snow, cut:
  - 2 (32" x 3") strips, *Bottom Band*.
  - 4 (12" x 9") rectangles, *Clouds*.
- 7. From batting, cut:
  - 2 (28" x 22") rectangles.

Cut the Rainbow Arcs and Clouds Note: Handle the cut arcs carefully, as most of the edges are on the bias.

- 1. Enlarge and cut out each template.
- 2. With the nap running down, trace template on wrong side of fabric.
- 3. Cut 2 of each color of Arc.
- 4. From Marble Snow, cut 2 and 2 reverse using the Cloud template—4 total.

#### Assembly


#### Create the rainbow

- 1. On the batting, draw a center vertical line and a line 5" up from the 28" edge.
- 2. Spray baste the wrong side of the Turquoise Arc.
  Smooth to batting, aligning flat edges of the arc to the drawn line.
- 3. Spray baste the wrong side of the Lilac Arc. Smooth to the batting, overlapping ½" over the Turquoise Arc.
- 4. Appliqué Lilac Arc to the Turquoise Arc with a zigzag or buttonhole stitch.
- 5. Using the same process, spray baste and appliqué Banana to Lilac and Coral to Banana.
- 6. Baste outside edge of Rainbow.

#### Add the clouds

1. Spray baste wrong side of Clouds. Align vertical dotted lines with Rainbow edges. Align horizontal dotted line with the baseline.

Note: Due to the bias edges, your dotted lines may not match exactly. This is fine.



Baste ¼"

- 2. Appliqué Clouds to Rainbow. Baste outer Cloud edges to batting. Trim batting close to basting stitches.
- 3. Repeat to make the Pillow Back.

#### Add the band

The Band color is pieced-as-you-go so that it matches the arcs and clouds. Match the nap of the Band at seams.

- 1. Starting 4" from the Coral Arc/ Cloud seam and leaving a 3" tail, pin the Paris Pink Band around the top edge until 2" from the Cloud. Sew the band to *this point* and backstitch.
- 2. Pin the last 2" to the edge of the Cloud. Mark the junction and cut ½" past the mark. Sew the pink and white Bands together.
- 3. Sew the white Band around the Cloud, stopping 2" before the Turquoise.

  Measure, add ½" seam allowance, cut, and sew these Bands together.
  - Note: Where the cloud curves meet, stop with the needle down and pivot.
- 4. Continue in this manner. Finish by sewing the second white section to the Paris Pink Band.

#### **Finishina**

1. Mark a 4" turning gap on the Back. Staystitch between the marks.



Note: Also staystitch a corresponding 4" gap on the Band.

- 2. Matching the color junctions, pin the Band to the Back. Leave the 4" gap open for turning.
- 3. Sew Band to the Back. 4 Pivot at color changes with needle down. Stitch an L-pivot at the gap.
  - Note: The L-pivot secures seam ends when turning the pillow and helps seam allowances turn in at the gap.
- 4. Turn right side out. Stuff as desired.
- 5. Pin the turning gap closed. Hand sew with a ladder stitch.



Ladder Stitch: Use polyester thread and a hand sewing needle to catch one side of the opening, then the other. Pull to tighten every few stitches.

#### Cuddle® Basics

- Mark measurements on the wrong side of Cuddle® with a felt tip marker or ballpoint pen.
- 2. Cut Cuddle® with a rotary cutter, craft knife, or scissors.
- Shake cut pieces or put in a no-heat dryer with a damp washcloth for a few minutes to remove loose fibers.
- 4. Sew with polyester thread in the top and the bobbin.
- 5. Reduce presser foot pressure when sewing multiple layers.

- 6. Increase stitch length to 2.5-4 mm.
- 7. Double pin by using 2 rows of pins the first row every 1½" along the seam line and a second row 1" to the left and parallel to the cut edge.
- 8. Backstitch at the beginning and end of each seam.
- 9. Seam allowances are ½" unless otherwise noted.
- 10. Use an even-feed or walking foot, if possible. It makes a difference!
