Traffic Light Pillow Approximate Finished Size: 8" x 16" diameter

It's all GO! with this traffic light pillow. It's a perfect addition to any playroom or child's bedroom. The narrow band and easy appliqué make completing this pillow a green light.

Fabric Requirements (as shown)

- ⁵/₈ yard Cuddle[®] 3 Black, *Pillow*
- 6" x 6" square each: Cuddle[®] 3 Red, Yellow, & Kelly Green, *Traffic Lights*

Suggested Notions

- Batting, 2 (10" x 18") rectangles
- Polyester filling for stuffing
- 90/14 stretch machine needle
- Polyester thread: black, red, yellow, and green
- Felt tip marker or ballpoint pen
- Rotary cutter and mat
- Micro-serrated scissors and/or craft knife
- Long, flower head pins
- Fabric clips
- Basting spray
- Walking foot

DIRECTIONS

Read Cuddle® Basics before beginning.

Right Side Wrong Side

Cutting

- 1. From Cuddle[®] 3 Black, cut: • 2 (9" x 17¹/₂") rectangles, Front & Back
 - 1 (2" x 54") strip, Band.
- 2. From Red, Yellow, and Kelly, cut:
 - 1 Circle* each color, Traffic Lights.
- 3. From cardstock, cut:
 - 1 Circle*.

Assembly

Stitch the Traffic Light outlines

- 1. On the wrong side of the Front, mark the center top and center bottom. Connect the lines.
- 2. Also on the wrong side, use the cardstock template to trace three Circles. Center the templates,

starting the first circle 1" from the top with $\frac{1}{2}$ " between the circles.


3. Using black thread, sew a straight stitch along the marked line.

> Note: The sewn line *will aid in placing the* lights in a future step.

Add the batting

- 1. Spray baste wrong side of Front and Back. Smooth onto batting.
- 2. Trim batting to the pillow edge.

- Add appliqués
 - 1. Spray baste backs of appliqués.
 - 2. Smooth into place on Front, using the stitched lines as guides. Have nap running down.



the appliqué color. - Straight stitch line 4. With black thread, straight stitch around each appliqué.

Note: The extra stitching line adds definition to each light.

Prepare the Band

- 1. Sew short ends of the Band strip together into a circle.
- 2. Fold Band in half with one seam allowance at the end. Mark the fold. Fold in half again. Mark the quarter points.



Attach the Band to the Front

- 1. Fold the Front in half vertically. Fold again horizontally. Pin mark the quarter points.
- 2. With the nap going away from the Front, match Band seam line to the bottom pin mark.
- 3. Pin top mark of Band to the top mark of the Front.
- 4. Pin guarter marks of the Band to the side pin marks.

5. Continue to pin Band to Front.

Note: Pin halfway between initial pins, then halfway between those pins, and so on. Pin a lot.


6. Sew the Band to the Front.

Finishing

- 1. Mark a 4" turning gap on the Back.
- 2. Staystitch between marks. Staystitch a corresponding 4" gap on Band.
- 3. Pin the Back to the Band.

4. Sew the Back to the Band, leaving

the 4" gap open for turning. Sew an L-pivot at the gap. *Note: The L-pivot* secures seam ends as the pillow is turned and helps the seam



allowance turn in at the gap. 5. Turn pillow right side out. Stuff as desired.



6. Pin the turning gap closed. Hand sew with a ladder stitch.

Ladder Stitch: Use polyester thread and a hand sewing needle to catch one side of the opening, then the other. Tighten every few stitches.

Cuddle[®] Basics

- 1. Seam allowances are $\frac{1}{2}$ unless otherwise noted.
- 2. Use a felt tip marker or ballpoint pen to trace appliqués or mark measurements on reverse side of Cuddle[®]
- 3. Cut Cuddle[®] with a rotary cutter, craft knife, or scissors.
- 4. Shake cut pieces or put in a no-heat dryer with a damp washcloth for a few minutes to remove loose fibers.
- 5. Sew with polyester thread in the top and the bobbin.

- 6. Reduce presser foot pressure when sewing multiple layers.
- 7. Increase stitch length to 3-4 mm.
- 8. Double pin by using 2 rows of pinsthe first row every $1^{1/2}$ " along the seam line and a second row 1" to the left and parallel to the cut edge.
- 9. Backstitch at the beginning and end of each seam.
- 10. Use an even-feed or walking foot, if possible. It makes a difference!
