## Self-Binding Blanket

Blanket—Approximate Finished Size: 36" x 36" Bonus Instructions inside: Make 2 Lovies, each approximately 17" square

A fun and easy way to make a sweet blanket without needing to add a separate binding. A clever, yet simple corner miter does the trick. Add some lovies from the Bonus Instructions and you have a go-to gift for any baby.

**Fabric Requirements** (*for a 36" x 36" blanket + 2 lovies*)

- 1 yards Cuddle<sup>®</sup> 3, Front
- 1<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> yards Luxe Cuddle<sup>®</sup> or Cuddle<sup>®</sup> 3, *Backing*

#### **Suggested Notions**

- Template plastic or cardstock
- 90/14 stretch machine needle
- Polyester thread
- Felt tip marker or ballpoint pen
- Rotary cutter and mat
- Micro-serrated scissors
- Craft knife
- Long, flower head pins
- Fabric clips
- Walking foot
- Basting spray

#### GENERAL DIRECTIONS

- Read Cuddle® Basics before beginning.
- Instructions are for the Blanket. The method is the same for the Lovies. See sidebar for details.

#### Cutting

- 1. From the [Front], mark and cut: • 1 (34" x 34") square.
- 2. From the [Backing], mark and cut: • 1 (40" x 40") square.

#### Assembly

#### Make the corner template

- 1. Cut a 6" square of template plastic or cardstock.
- 2. At one corner, mark intersecting lines 2" parallel to the edges.
- 3. Mark a 45° line that intersects the 2" marks.

4. Cut on the line to create the corner

Make a Wider-or Narrower-Border The 2" marks create a 2" border. For a 3" border, draw the intersecting lines *3" from each edge. Mark the 45° line* through that intersection. All of the other assembly instructions remain the same.

#### Make the corners

- 1. Place the template corner on the wrong side of the
- Backing as shown. 1. Place template. 2. Mark the edge of the template. 2. On each corner, mark the diagonal Wrona Side line of the template.

*Note: The marked line is a stitching* line. **Do not cut** on this line!

BACKING

- 3. Right sides together, fold the corner on the diagonal, matching the marked line.
- line. Stitch on the line. Pin and stitch the other corners. 5. Turn the corners to check if they
- are mitered and lie flat. If so, trim the seam allowance to 1/2" and flip the corner back to wrong side out.

*Note: If the corners do not lie flat,* check that the marked lines match. *Restitch if necessary.* 

#### Finishina

#### Add the Front fabric

- 1. Smooth the Backing, wrong side up, on a large, flat surface.
- 2. Wrong sides together, Center and smooth Front onto Backing. Tuck Front edges under the frame and

mitered corners.

Tuck Front edges under the Frame.

#### 3. Spray baste 🔿 wrong side of Front one section at a time.

Smooth the edges under the frame.

4. Pin edges through all layers, parallel to Double pin parallel to raw edge the raw edge.

Backing (wrong side)

5. Using a wide zigzag (5mm x 5mm), stitch the raw edge of the border around entire blanket. Zigzag edge

*Note: If using Cuddle*<sup>®</sup> 3 *for* the Backing, use a blanket or serpentine stitch for a finished look. If using Luxe Cuddle<sup>®</sup>, a zigzag stitch works best.

#### Cuddle<sup>®</sup> Basics

- 1. Seam allowances are  $\frac{1}{2}$  unless otherwise noted.
- 2. Mark measurements on wrong side of Cuddle® with a felt tip marker or ballpoint pen.
- 3. Cut with a rotary cutter, craft knife, or scissors.
- 4. Shake cut pieces or put in a no-heat dryer with a damp washcloth for a few minutes to remove loose fibers.
- 5. Sew with polyester thread in the top and the bobbin.

### Lovies

Lovies use the same construction *method as the Blanket—only a few* measurements are different.

Here are the Lovie changes: Makes 2 Lovies

- 1. From the remaining Front fabric, mark and cut:
  - 2 (16" x 16") squares.
- 2. From remaining Backing, mark and cut:
  - 2 (20" x 20") squares.


#### Assembly

- For the template, mark 1<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" (instead of 2") from each corner.
- Mark a 45° line that intersects the marks.
- Cut on the line to create the corner template for the Lovie.

#### Finishina

- Use the Blanket instructions to complete the Lovie.
- 6. Reduce presser foot pressure when sewing multiple layers.
- 7. Increase stitch length to 3–4 mm.
- 8. Double pin by using 2 rows of pinsthe first row every  $1\frac{1}{2}$ " along the seam line and a second row 1" to the left and parallel to the cut edge.
- 9. Backstitch at the beginning and end of each seam.
- 10. Use an even-feed or walking foot, if possible. It makes a difference!





4. Pin on both sides of the Stitch on marked line.
