

Quick Cuddle Scarf

You can make these beautiful scarves from Shannon Fabrics Cuddle!

This is the perfect scarf to fit under a jacket or coat.
They are easy and quick to make. Excellent family, teacher,
or office gifts; once you make one, you'll want to make more!

Supplies:

1 yard of Shannon Fabrics Cuddle
Rotary Cutter and Ruler
Sewing machine with a walking foot or even-feed foot
Thread to match
90/14 Stretch sewing machine needle
Pins



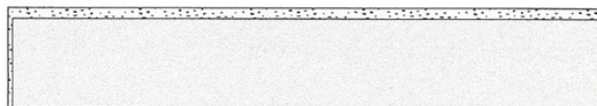

You may sub-cut your yard of fabric two ways:

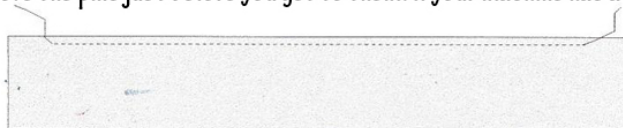
Option 1: Cut into two 18" x 60" - for 2 long infinity scarves.

Option 2: Cut into three 19 3/4" x 36" - for 3 short infinity scarves

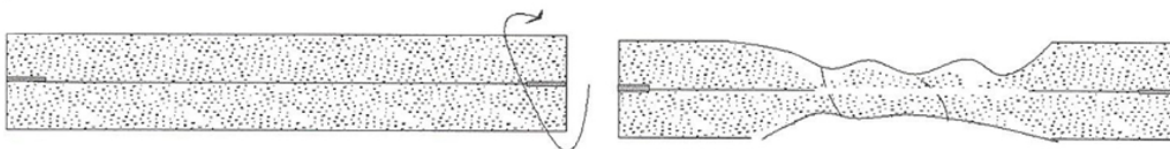
1. Fold the 18" x 60" piece of fabric in half (19 3/4" x 36" for option 2), Right Sides Together (RST) and pin.



2. Set your machine stitch length to 3.2-3.6 (approx. 8 stitches per inch) or less. You can check this by sewing a swatch and laying your ruler next to the stitches to measure. Using a 1/2" seam allowance, begin and end the seam 3 to 4" from either end as shown. Sew S-L-O-W-L-Y. Remove the pins just before you get to them. If your machine has a "needle down" feature, engage it.



3. Now, reach into one of the short sides and pull the fabric back through to turn Right Side Out (RSO). Lay the scarf down on a table with the seam centered on the top as shown. Lift the left short edge of the scarf and turn it two times in the direction indicated by the arrow.



4. Fold the scarf in half RST and carefully pin along the short edges. Sew using your 1/2" seam allowance. Pull the ends of the scarf and the seam will "pop" back inside. You can whip stitch the opening closed by hand or, if your fabric is "fluffy" you can top-stitch the opening closed by machine.

Wrap it once or twice around your neck (depending on the option you chose above). You can fold it in half and tuck one end inside the other. Experiment with different ways to wear your new Infinity Scarf!
